FOREWORD

Alla

We heartily welcome all who have come here today to rejoice with us on this solemn occasion. We extend a special welcome to Bishop Edward Daly and we thank him for his interest and support from the moment the building of our new church was first mooted. We are also very pleased that so many priests who are natives of the parish, or who have served here in the past, have been able to join us in concelebrating the Mass of Dedication.

At last, having experienced for almost seven years the limitations imposed by the celebration of Sunday and Holyday Masses in the assembly-hall of our secondary school, the parishioners now have a worthy building in which their sacramental and devotional life may be nourished and in which they can participate fully in the supreme liturgical action of Holy Mass. The incorporation of a presbytery to house two curates as a feature of the design will, we feel sure, make possible a better service for those living in an area of the parish which has been developed intensely in recent years.

Particular pride is taken from the fact that a native of the parish designed our new church and that a parishioner constructed it. We warmly congratulate both men, and all those who have cooperated with them in this project, on a very fine achievement.

Our deepest gratitude is reserved for our own parishioners. Their encouragement and generosity have been truly heartening. Most parishes setting out to build a church would have the bulk of the money needed for it already gathered. In contrast, the parish of Glendermott was heavily in debt before embarking on this project. Future generations will have cause to marvel at the degree of confidence in God and the spirit of self-sacrifice displayed by the present parishioners.

We pray that our new church, dedicated today in honour of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, may always be an effective sign of the abiding presence of God among his people. Through the intercession of Our Lady, may the peace of Christ be in the hearts and homes of all who come to worship here.

ABOUT THE NEW CHURCH ...

The plan of the church approximates to a fan-shape. A large sanctuary is arranged at the wider end. The congregation is thus gathered close to the Altar and encouraged to participate in the Mass and ceremonies. Advantage has been taken of the greater dimension across this end of the church to accommodate two confessionals and the organ on one side of the santuary, with the Baptismal Font and the Shrine of Our Lady on the other. On this latter side, set into the wall, is the foundation stone in polished Kilkenny limestone which was blessed by Pope John Paul II and was laid by Bishop Edward Daly.

A feature of the generous santuary is the elevated position of the Ambo and Chair which are raised four steps above the predella on which stands the onyx Altar mensa supported on twelve columns carved in the same material. The completely veiled Tabernacle is carried on a Sicilian marble shelf to one side of the santuary surrounded by four plaques with relief carvings symbolic of the Eucharist.

Along the low flanking walls of the nave sixteen square windows with leaded glazing, designed by Oonagh Madden. provide intervening positions for the lindenwood Stations of the Cross which were hand-carved in Germany. The four corners of the nave have been selected for the consecration crosses which are en suite with the foundation stone.

The main lighting of the church is from the large area of insulated glazing arranged around the apex of the roof. The double layers of this laminated glass allow unusual views from the nave of the large external cross.

The mahogany seating provides accommodation for a congregation of 600 and is subdivided by six aisles to permit convenient circulation for Holy Communion. No seat is further than 16 metres from the Altar.

At the narrower end, the main porch, with entrance doors on opposite sides, has been placed where it can also provide access to the sacristies and the presbytery. Because of the steep fall across the site it was found possible to plan the presbytery on two floors. At first floor level, which is a continuation of that in the church, accommodation has been provided for one visiting and two resident priests. The dining room, office, entrance hall and housekeeper's accommodation occupy the ground floor At this level also is the boiler room containing two oil fired boilers, one for the presbytery and a second to circulate ducted warm air by means of an air-handling unit to the church. The system is designed to introduce external air in the event of excessive humidity.

Four graduated steel portal frames support the rising roof from its lowest level over the porch to its apex, where a base is provided for the four-metre high cross cast in fibre glass around a hollow steel cave. A series of semi-portals converging on the apex define the folded roof form over the sanctuary. The reverse slope of roof over the presbytery is in traditional timber construction.

The continuous roof is covered with blue-black asbestos slating and lined internally in the church with redwood sheeting in a pattern of opposing diagonals. The portal frames have been sheathed to match. Externally the walls of the building are dry dashed with crushed shell chippings. Internally the walls of the church are finished with decorated rough cast plaster. The entire sanctuary is floored with German ceramic tiles and the floor of the nave is covered with nylon carpet.

SOMETHING OLD

The Hammond Organ was presented to the parish for use in our new church by the United States Navy when the base at Clooney was decommissioned in 1977.

The statute of Our Lady was for many years in the Convent of Mercy, Pump Street. The Sisters have presented it to our new church.

The parish of Desertegney and Lower Fahan has presented us with the Baptismal Font and other items of Italian onyx and Sicilian marble which were in use at Saint Mary's Oratory, Buncrana for fifty years prior to its renovation in 1979. These now furnish our sanctuary with the addition of twelve new onyx supports for the altar and new top and bottom sheets of Sicilian marble for the altar table.

For all these gifts we are deeply grateful.

The concelebrants of the Mass of Dedication are wearing the vestments which were specially designed for the Papal Mass at Knock in September, 1979. We are indebted to Monsignor James Horan for this privilege.

SIGNIFICANT DATES ...

12 May 1978

F. M. Corr and Associates were commissioned by Reverend Austin Duffy, P.P., to design a new church to seat 600 people and a presbytery for two curates on a site at Trench Road which had been acquired by Reverend John McGaughey, P.P.

22 February 1979

Bishop Edward Daly gave formal approval for the title "Church of the Immaculate Conception.

30 May 1979

Sketch plans were approved by the Diocesan Liturgical Commission.

5 July 1979

Sketch plans were approved by the Diocesan Building Committee

30 September 1979

The Foundation Stone was blessed by Pope John Paul II during his Pastoral Visit to Our Lady's Shrine at Knock.

21 March 1980

Tenders for the construction of the new church and presbytery were received.

25 March 1980

The ceremony of cutting the first sod was performed by Reverend Austin Duffy, P.P.

2 April 1980

The tender submitted by Gerald McCormick to build the new church and presbytery for a sum of £258,000.00 was accepted.

12 May 1980

Gerald McCormick commenced work on the site. Under the terms of his contract the building is due to be completed by 12 August 1981.

26 July 1980

The ceremony of laying the Foundation Stone was performed by Bishop Edward Daly.

May 1981

The presbytery was formally handed over by the contractor. Reverend Eamon McDevitt, C.C., and Reverend Neil Farren, C.C., took up residence.

31 May 1981

The new church is solemnly dedicatedten weeks ahead of schedule. Deo gratias.

INTRODUCTORY RITES

STAND

SOLEMN ENTRANCE

The clergy, the concelebrants and the bishop approach the closed doors of the new church from the outside, where a representative group of the people is already assembled.

· BISHOP:

The grace and peace of God be with all of you in his holy Church.

ALL: And also with you.

Then the bishop briefly addresses the people.

The main contractor presents the keys of the new church to the bishop to mark the formal handing over of the completed building.

The architect then addresses the bishop and the people, pointing out what the new church expresses in its art and in its own special design.

The bishop then calls upon the parish priest of Glendermott, to whom the pastoral care of the church has been entrusted, to open the doors of the new church.

When this has been done the bishop invites the people to enter the church.

BISHOP:

BLESSING AND SPRINKLING OF WATER

The bishop blesses water with which to sprinkle the peop as a sign of repentance and as a reminder of their Baptisn and to purify the walls and the altar of the new church.

BISHOP:

Brothers and sisters in Christ, in this solemn rite of dedication, let us ask the Lord our God to bless this water created by his hand.

It is a sign of our repentance, a reminder of our Baptism, and a symbol of the cleansing of these walls and this altar.

May the grace of God help us to remain faithful members of his Church, open to the Spirit we have received.

All pray in silence for a brief period. The bishop the continues:

God of mercy, You call every creature to the light of life. and surround us with such great love that when we stray you continually lead us back to Christ our head. For you have established an inheritance of such mercy that those sinners, who pass through water made sacred. die with Christ and rise restored as members of his body and heirs of his eternal covenant. Bless this water: sanctify it. As it is sprinkled upon us and throughout this church make it a sign of the saving waters of baptism, by which we become one in Christ, the temple of your Spirit May all here today. and all those in days to come, who will celebrate your mysteries in this church, be united at last in the holy city of your peace. We ask this in the name of Jesus the Lord.

The bishop takes The Lectionary, shows it to the people, and says:

May the word of God always be heard in this place, as it unfolds the mystery of Christ before you and achieves your salvation within the Church.

SIT FIRST READER:

A reading from the book of Nehemiah.

All the people gathered as one man on the square before the Water Gate. They asked Ezra the scribe to bring the Book of the Law of Moses which the Lord had prescribed for Israel. Accordingly Ezra the priest brought the Law before the assembly, consisting of men, women and children old enough to understand. This was the first day of the seventh month. On the square before the Water Gate, in the presence of the men and women and children old enough to understand, he read from the book from early morning till noon; all the people listened attentively to the Book of the Law, Ezra the scribe stood on a wooden dais erected for the purpose. In full view of all the people - since he stood higher than all the people - Ezra opened the book; and when he opened it all the people stood up. Then Ezra blessed the Lord, the great God, and all the people raised their hands and answered, "Amen! Amen!"; then they bowed down and, face to the ground, prostrated themselves before the Lord. And Ezra read from the Law of God, translating and giving the sense, so that the people understood what was read. Then Ezra, priest and scribe, said to all the people, "This day is sacred to the Lord your God. Do not be mournful, do not weep." For the people were all in tears as they listened to the words of the Law. He then said, "Go, eat the fat, drink the sweet wine, and send a portion to the man who has nothing prepared ready. one which has already been laid, that is Jesus Christ. On this foundation you can build in gold, silver and jewels, or in wood, grass and straw, but whatever the material, the work of each builder is going to be clearly revealed when the day comes. That day will begin with fire, and the fire will test the quality of each man's work. Didn't you realise that you were God's temple and that the Spirit of God was living among you? If anybody should destroy the temple of God, God will destroy him, because the temple of God is sacred; and you are that temple.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness

ANOINTING OF THE ALTAR AND THE WALLS OF THE CHURCH

The bishop anoints the middle of the altar table and each of its four corners with sacred chrism, saying:

We now anoint this altar and this building.
May God in his power make them holy,

After he has anointed the altar, the bishop gives the task of anointing the walls of the church to four of the curates of Glendermott by handing them vessels of sacred chrism.

INCENSATION OF THE ALTAR AND THE CHURCH

The bishop puts incense into two thuribles, saying:

BISHOP:

Lord,
May our prayer ascend as incense in your sight.
As this building is filled with fragrance
so may your Church fill the world

Because it is at the altar that the memorial of the Lord is celebrated and his body and blood given to the people, we seen in the altar a sign of Christ himself. For this reason the bishop now uses one of the thuribles to reverence the altar with incense. The bishop himself is then saulted with incense. After this, two concelebrants incense the people and the walls of the church.

The altar is now prepared for the celebration of Mass. The bishop gives the lighted paschal candle to the parish priest, saying:
