# LACK OF ACTION

In today's Gospel Jesus tells the story of two men, a rich man and a poor man. In the first scene we find details about the rich man's wardrobe and how he feasts. In contrast to the rich man, we find the poor man, Lazarus by name, lying at the gate. He does not expect to get invited to the rich man's house he wishes only for the scraps that fall from the rich man's table. The first scene ends with the death of both men.

In the next scene we are in the other world and there is a reversal of fortunes. Lazarus now reclines in a place of honour at the heavenly banquet while the rich man is in agony. His wardrobe is gone and his feasting is finished.

The rich man did nothing to Lazarus, but he was not innocent. His lack of action was his crime.

In the "I Confess" we ask forgiveness for "what I have done and what I have failed to do". In her book Suffering Dorothee Soelle makes the point well when she writes: "When you look at human suffering concretely you destroy all innocence, all neutrality, every attempt to say, "It wasn't I; there was nothing I could do; I didn't know." In the face of suffering, you are either with the victim or the executioner – there is no other option."
