THE INVITATION IS TODAY

St Luke's gospel, and particularly our Gospel reading this weekend, the focus is on Jesus calling each person individually and saving people today. Jesus calls Zacchaeus by name and says that he wants to stay at his house today and that salvation has come to his house today. For Jesus each person is important and today is the day.

Zacchaeus showed himself to be open to the call of Jesus, much to the surprise of the people who thought there was no good in a tax collector. Zacchaeus had become rich of the backs of the people, and they thoroughly disliked him. Yet he was the one singled out by Jesus and surprised everyone by responding positively. As a result he has become a new person. His manner of life and living has changed – he can look at himself and others with love.

For many people, faith and religion is about the past. People say "I was baptised", "I made my first Holy Communion"; "I was confirmed". All use of the past tense. For Jesus faith is about today and the future. Let us pray that our faith is alive and active in the here and now rather than a dust memory.

The same Jesus who invited Zacchaeus to follow him is continuing to invite people.
