It is never too Late.

Most of us get annoyed when people say they will do something for us and then fail to deliver on their promise. We end up feeling let down. Yet, if we are honest with ourselves, we will recognise that we all fail in this respect, to some extent at least.

We have all said that we will do this or that and then failed to do it. In that sense, there is something of the second son in today's parable in all of us, the son who told his father he would work in the vineyard, but never did so. Our 'yes' can become a 'no' in practice.

There can be many reasons for this. We may say 'yes' just to keep someone happy, without ever really intending to follow up on what we are asked. Or some of us may find it hard to say 'no'. We may tend to say 'yes' to every request and have the intention to follow through, even though we could not possibly do all that we promise to do.

The gospels proclaim that it is never too late to change for the better. That is a message which we all need to hear. Whatever 'no's we may have said in the past need not determine our present or future responses.

Each day is a new day, a new opportunity to say 'yes' to the Lord's call as it comes to us through those among whom we live and work. 'Today' is what matters, not yesterday — in the words of Psalm 95, 'O that today we would listen to his voice; harden not our hearts'.

Every 'today' is a new opportunity to think better of something and to make a more generous response to life's call, to God's call — an opportunity to put on the 'mind of Christ' that St Paul speaks about in our second reading. That mind of Christ shows itself in a willingness to put the interests of others before our own, just as Christ emptied himself for the sake of us all.

It is never too late to grow more fully into the mind and heart of Christ.
