No one is excluded.

God often experiences refusal and rejection from those to whom he offers his gifts. He, however, is not discouraged. That is why, as found in the Gospel this weekend, He sends his servants to go out to all the byways and invite everyone they meet, both good and bad people, without any distinction. It is striking that bad people are also invited. Our Lord excludes no one from his call.

Men and women from every background and social condition, even those who do not pray or even know much about God – all are called to holiness, to share in the glory of heaven. God's invitation to participate in heavenly glory is generous and universal.

But the Gospel continues: "When the king came in to look at the guests, he saw there a man who had no wedding garment" (v.11). The door is open for everyone who wishes to enter, but before glory there will be judgement.

The supreme judge, who can discern the deepest recesses of the heart, will decide what is of value in each person's life.

Jesus's parable makes clear that, whatever ones past action may have been, the indispensable condition is to wear the wedding garment, that is: to have our soul clean and have a repentant heart; to embrace a way of life that gives testimony to love for God and neighbour.

World Mission Sunday - Mission Sunday is vital to the growth of the church and the spread of the gospel in predominantly impoverished and remote areas overseas. The funds raised build much-needed infrastructure, from chapels and schools to orphanages, clinics and dispensaries. Our support can transform lives and create a hub from which the young Church can flourish and grow.

As well as our financial support our prayers are also important. In 2022, 18 missionaries were killed worldwide, 12 priests, 1 religious brother, 3 sisters, 1 seminarian, and one lay person. So, our prayers are needed for missionaries living in difficult situations.
