## The truth Jesus provides!

"O terrible human blindness! So great a light about you and you do not see."

(St John of the Cross).

Jesus describes the Scribes and Pharisees as 'blind guides' who have failed to see the light. Over time they have become trapped in seeking notice and seeing privilege as an entitlement Jesus offers them a model of how humble leadership can bring people to a place where they have never been before.

Because there are obvious contradictions between what they say and what they do, their witness is sending out a double message. When they arrogate titles to themselves or seek attention and notice, their behaviour is self-serving.

The problems are compounded by the fact that they don't seem at all aware of the defective leadership they are providing. As can easily happen, the truth that they see blinds them to the truth they don't see. The truth that Jesus presents is not just for them; it is for all.

What is disturbing about today's gospel message is how sincerely religious people can delude themselves.

No generation can afford to be presumptuous that it has got it right because sin has a capacity to blind and any and all to its presence. It resists discovery and it blinds as it spreads.

Motives can be mixed. Good deeds can be done to give honour to God or done for selfish reasons. They could be done to win praise or popularity.

Like the Pharisees we all have a need to be liked, to be noticed, to avoid criticism, to avoid suffering. Those needs don't go away, but we can recognise them, work with them, and choose to serve God in all we undertake. 'Know yourself'- that wisdom from ancient Greece is still sound advice.
