Sunday, 24th December 2023 Fourth Sunday of Advent

"I am the handmaid of the Lord, let what you have said be done to me"

"Christmas was built upon a beautiful and intentional paradox, that the birth of the homeless should be celebrated in every home" (G. K. Chesteron)

In Mary, the word of God becomes flesh, becomes a living person. Jesus came among us so that everyone might know him as someone living and life-giving to them. Like Mary we are invited to be receptive to his word in faith.

In St Luke's account of the Annunciation we get a portrait of Mary's soul. When the shepherds came to Bethlehem to see the child we hear nothing from Mary. She is silent. A mother normally draws attention not to herself but to her child. At Bethlehem Mary is silent about Jesus. It is the shepherds who talk about him and praise God for what they have seen.

Christmas is about our call to be little. In Bethlehem those who were little in the eyes of the world were the most receptive to Jesus and to the gifts that he brought. Mary, Joseph, the shepherds and the Magi continue to show us how to welcome the gift of Jesus and the gospel he proclaims from the manger.

The manger reveals some central gospel truths. The whole gospel is contained in the manger. There is the physical poverty of the manger and that of humble surroundings. There is the poverty of being born far away from home, from family, relatives and neighbours. There is also the poverty of being helpless. In the manger Jesus is all dependent, open to receive from others. Those who are little are capable of receiving from God and others. The ability to receive with graciousness is a mark of human and Christian maturity. It is acknowledging that we need each other.

The challenge from all of us is to ruminate on and digest the Christmas message and make it our own.
