"Come and See"

There are so many things competing for our attention nowadays. We are exposed to a cacophony of voices, each proposing its own agenda and promising us fulfilment and happiness. All that is fine, provided we also have a listening ear for the voice of the Lord which speaks to us in a myriad of ways, in prayer, from the scriptures, in the sacraments, and through other people, especially those most in need, spiritually and materially.

In our first reading today from the Old Testament the young boy Samual heard a voice and he presumed it was that of the prophet Eli. But it was the Lord who was calling him. Once he realised that, he followed the advice of Eli and responded as follows: 'Speak Lord, your servant is listening'. So, this is the first message from the word of God inn today's Mass: God is calling us to listen to him. But the question arises; what God says to us. Well, we find the answer in the gospel we have just heard proclaimed. Jesus invites two curious followers to 'come and see'.

The two disciples set off immediately to follow Jesus. Now it's Jesus' turn to 'see': he sees the disciples following him and he initiates a conversation. He finds out that they want to know where he lives. Jesus utters the immortal words, 'Come and see'. We notice immediately that Jesus doesn't enter a dialogue with his two followers. He invites them to experience his presence, to come with him.

Andrew and his brother Simon Peter were privileged to share the day-to-day experiences of being with Jesus. They saw his miracles and his ling nights spent in prayer to his Father but they also saw him struggle with the human condition: hunger and thirst, rejection, pain and suffering and eventually a cruel death.
