Sunday, 28th January 2024 Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

'Chrístmas day ís every day.'

It is now four weeks since we celebrated Christmas. Looking back at the hype that surrounds this feast we may be tempted to

ask: What was it all for? We are back to school and work again, and it seems as if Christmas never happened.

Christmas commemorates the earth-shattering event whereby God became man in the person of Jesus. We call that the incarnation (become human). But the incarnation is not just about a baby in a manger. The incarnation is the lifelong event that began in Bethlehem and took Jesus to Calvary and the Garden of Resurrection.

The *first* reading in today's Mass anticipates the Christmas event. Moses tells the people that a great prophet will rise up among them. He didn't fully realise what he was predicting that this great prophet would be Jesus. This weekend we are presented in the gospel of Mark with two significant truths about Jesus.

First, we are told that he had authority. 'His teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority.' In our language today we might say he had the cut of a leader about him.

The *second* quality devolves from this. He had power over evil. He casts out demons and heals many beleaguered people. None of us has his power to destroy evil but we have the great gift of prayer. We can pray that evil in all its manifestations will be destroyed by the power of God.

So you see that when we look at the qualities of Jesus presented to us in the gospel on Sunday we can apply them in the most practical ways to our weekday lives. Christmas Day is every day. (Furrow Dec 2023)
