# 'Through our actions to others'

Most of us are familiar enough with growing tomatoes, apples, etc to know that no branch, if separated from its trunk, will survive for long. And that is the point St John is making in today's gospel – that no branch will survive if it is separated from its tree trunk.

The life-giving nutrients or nourishments that come from the earth are drawn up through the trunk and are spread around the branches through the sap. The sap is literally the lifeblood of the tree. But, if the branch is separated, or broken off from the trunk, then without its lifeblood it will quickly die.

St John, in today's gospel, likens us – individual Christians – to the vine branches. If we are not united or joined to Christ – our trunk – then we cannot flourish or bear fruit. However, if we are united to Christ we will bear abundant fruit.

Today's gospel says: "Cut off from me (Christ) you can do nothing." Cut off from Christ we can achieve nothing worthwhile. But, if Christ is literally our lifeblood, then we can bear much fruit, we can do great things.

But what does St John mean by this last sentence? How can Christ be our lifeblood? He gives us the answer in the Second Reading of today's Mass. There we are told that if we keep the commandments of loving God and loving our neighbour, then we live in God and God lives in us" (John 3:24). Then, the love of God, the love that is God, will course through our veins and will reach out – will be channelled out – through our actions to others.

If God's love is coursing through our veins, pumping through our hearts, flowing through our thoughts and actions, then it cannot but bring that same Christ-like peace, pardon, help, hope, and love to others – and that cannot but help others; it cannot but be 'a sacrament of God's love for them,' a visible sign of God's love. **Furrow 2024**
