Everything under God's protection.

Today's gospel is a call to every disciple of Jesus to share the light of the gospel so that others might come to know the joy of meeting the risen Lord, bask in the light he brings to the world and experience the living presence of God all their days.

The feast of the Holy Trinity reminds us that when we make the sign of the cross at the beginning of the day or at the beginning of prayer, we are making a commitment to act in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. We are consciously choosing to do what we do in their name.

We mark our activity and our rest, our joys, and our sorrows with the sign of the cross and the name of the Trinity. All is consecrated to their name. The cross means sacrifice made from love; it is death for resurrection.

To make the sign of the cross over our actions means to wipe out what is selfish and so set us free to love. It means renouncing what is empty, renouncing prestige, and the longing to possess and dominate, in order to consecrate all to Christ. It is the sacrifice of self for a higher life. Works done out of selfishness cannot carry the sign of the cross. They are not yet crucified; they are not yet consecrated to Christ.

To eliminate selfish motivations from our actions is to mark them with the sign of the cross. It makes them available for a new dynamism, for service done in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. In that we see something of the greatness of becoming holy, of being consecrated to the Lord, of living for him.

The sign of the cross places everything under God's protection.
