Feast of St Columba (Tenth week in Ordinary Time)

From the outset Jesus had to deal with misunderstanding, obstruction, rejection and opposition, even, as today's gospel reading reveals, from among his own relatives. Reacting neither with anger nor annoyance, Jesus uses this conflict to teach us an important truth about the Kingdom of God, and to clarify who are the members of his true family, namely, those who do the will of God.

Discerning and carrying out the will of God, his Father, was the dominant passion of Jesus' life. It led him to leave his home in Nazareth and assume the life of an itinerant preacher: proclaiming God's reign of truth, justice and love, healing the sick, and liberating people from the power of evil. His words and actions presented a consistent challenge to the religious authorities of his day.

In today's gospel reading Mark tells us that when Jesus and his disciples arrived back home in Nazareth, such a huge crowd of people gathered around him 'that they could not even have a meal' (Mk 3:30). Sadly, neither his relatives nor the religious experts from Jerusalem, who had come to check him out, are among his admirers. His relatives, Mark informs us, 'set out to take charge of him, convinced he was out of his mind' Mk 3:21). In other words, they are accusing Jesus of being in league with the forces of evil.

Mark then tells us that Jesus' mother and brothers arrived. Waiting outside the house where Jesus and his disciples are staying, they 'send in a message asking for him' (Mk 3:32). And Jesus responds by asking: "Who are my mother and my brothers?" And looking round at those sitting in a circle around him, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers!" (Mk 3:34 He is not disowning his mother or brothers but creating a new and larger family of relationships. 'Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother' (Mk:35).

The new family of Jesus challenges us to cross national, cultural and social boundaries and build authentic human community on the basis of God's reign of justice, peace and love.
