Living in a world without windows

An Australian business leader once wrote; "Whenever I meet a Buddhist leader, I meet a holy man in touch with another world. Whenever I meet a Christian leader, I meet a manager at home only in this world like I am."

Jesus has called us to a kingdom and a life different to this world by its supernatural dimensions. Following Jesus is a matter of another reality. It is not merely a religious sentiment. For the follower of Christ, it is a matter of a different world, different energies, different possibilities and different prospects. Without faith and belief in another life we are like people living in a house without windows.

The themes of vocation and mission are highlighted in two of today's readings. Both readings remind us that those chosen to bring the Word of God to others must rely, not on their own resources, but on the authority of the one who sends them.

Amos, the first of the great prophets, lived in the eighth century before Christ. This was a time of peace and prosperity. It was also a time of wholesale corruption and exploitation of the poor. Amos courageously denounced the injustices inflicted upon the poor.

Amos defends his prophetic vocation as a direct call from the Lord. He was poor farmer, taking care of sycamore trees, before the Lord summoned him to go and prophesy to the people. This is the call he must obey, not the orders of a wellheeled flunkey of the royal court. The example of Amos reminds us of our prophetic vocation as members of Christ's Body to speak truth to power, to point out and denounce the corrupt practices of powerful elites, and to defend the rights of the poor and exploited people of our time.
