# Faith is a choice

No one can provide absolute proof to convince us that a loving God exists. Indeed, there are times when the suffering, death, evil, fear and terror that are part of our world seem to say that a loving God does not exist. If we limit ourselves to what we see with our eyes it may not inspire us to faith in a God who is gracious and kind.

Faith is a new way of seeing and hearing. Faith involves a decision, a choice that gives direction to how we live. It is trust in Jesus and his claim that He was sent by God the Father. Most of those who listened to the teaching of Jesus about the bread come down from heaven rejected his claims and walked away.

Faith is a choice, a decision to choose life and it is a lifelong decision. It is an ongoing choice as life's experiences calls for new ways of seeing and hearing. It involves a commitment to stay with him and learn from him always believing that Jesus was sent by the Father and that it is God the Father who draws us to him.

Bread gives us strength, energy, and life. In giving us the bread come down from heaven Jesus comes to live in us and give us the energy of self-giving in love. The strength, energy and life that are available to us through the Eucharist needs to be released again and again through prayer.

The Eucharist must make a difference in how we live. For those who receive the Eucharist the true colour of life is love. Love comes from God and draws us towards God. The main fruit of the Eucharist is love, the love of God that is poured into our hearts and inspires us to give of ourselves in love.

## The Assumption of Mary

"I picture the Assumption of Mary as her homecoming! Having completed the mission of her earthly life and longing to be with Jesus and Joseph, Mary is now reunited with her son and her husband.

I also find myself wondering how Mary's Assumption affected John and the other disciples. Mary was no longer physically present with them, they could not see or hear her, they could not confide in her and seek counsel from her. What a challenge to their faith in Jesus and His promises. With Mary's body literally gone and no burial site to visit, there was no physical reminder of Mary, only memories and at times, an unexplainable presence.

In our own day, many of us have met or known persons who have experienced the loss of a loved one because of war, accident, violence, unknown circumstances, etc. and the body is never located. The feast of Mary's Assumption gives hope and consolation to them as they grieve and mourn the loss of their loved one, believing that the person is not lost or annihilated, but enjoys eternal life with their God who loves unconditionally.

The Assumption symbolises for me the fulfilment of Jesus' promise, 'I go to prepare a place for you.' (John 14:2). This scriptural quote speaks to me of transition, Mary's Assumption brings hope and a deepening realisation that present life, with its challenges, joys, struggles and dreams is not the definitive heaven we seek. As the funeral liturgy states: Life is changed, not taken away. If I, like Mary, continue to walk the path of my baptismal and vowed commitment wherever God leads me, I, too, will be raised up and reach the place that Jesus has prepared for me".
