## 'I Am the Bread of Life'

In the gospel according to John two words are repeated regularly to leave a lasting imprint on our awareness of Jesus: "I AM".

Of course we use these words ourselves all the time: 'I am from Ireland', 'I'm tired', 'I am on the way to the shop'. But in the gospel according to John the words 'I am' are used regularly in a solemn and beautiful manner: I am the Bread of Life, I am the Good Shepherd, I am the Gate, I am the way and so on.

Hidden behind these simple words is the mysterious name of God. Remember the call of Moses at the burning bush, when he was sent to bring his people out of slavery in Egypt. He asked the Lord for his name. He was told to say 'I AM has sent me...' Now Jesus says, 'I Am...I AM...' His awesome identity is being hinted at through the repetition of these mysterious words.

If Jesus really is, then everything he has being saying in the gospel accounts of recent Sundays makes sense: He is the bread which come down from Heaven. He invites us to come to him, to believe in him, to entrust ourselves to him, to listen to him, to learn from him.

Today he takes it even further: the bread that I shall give is my flesh for the life of the world. I AM has taken flesh. The life that comes from heaven, the life that took flesh among us, is given as bodily food and drink.

Sharing in this food is sharing in the life of God himself. The sharing in God's life implies everything else that Jesus has been speaking about: coming to him, believing in him, entrusting our lives to him, listening to him, learning from him. What we do at his table every Sunday is the culmination of all of this; It is also the fountain of life that makes it all possible.

## Saints of the Week:

**The Queenship of Mary**. During the Middle Ages, Mary was venerated as queen of the angels and saints. Pope Pius XII prescribed the memorial for the universal Church at the close of the Marian Year 1955. It is placed on this day to stress the connection of Mary's queenship with the Assumption.

**St Pius X, 1835-1914,** Cardinal Patriarch of Venice, then Pope from 1903. Encouraged pastoral liturgy and sacramental practice, especially of frequent communion, to which he admitted young children.

**St Bernard, 1090-1153,** became a Cistercian monk of Citeaux in 1113 and was chosen Abbot of Clairvaux in 1115. His writings reveal a solid group of biblical studies, spiritual theology and philosophy, Patron of Gibraltar and beekeepers.
