On his way from Caeserea Phillipi to Capernaum Jesus loses no time to continue to instruct his disciples about what lay ahead in Jerusalem. He will meet opposition; evil will fight against good and terrible violence will be unleashed against him. Jesus is trying his best to prepare his closest friend for what lay ahead. Perhaps they were in denial and didn't want to spend too much time thinking about it. Whatever their reasons Jesus failed to get their full attention. Instead of reflecting on the harsh reality that lay ahead they became preoccupied with who is the greatest among them.

Their failure to understand gives Him another opportunity to expand on what he had been saying. His way is not about greatness but about the way of service. In his kingdom service is the sole criterion for measuring greatness and success.

Service is God's way; it does not always bring us the place we want to be but rather brings us to the place where God wants us.
