"You shall be my witnesses" (Acts 1:8)

In the Catholic Church, October has long been associated with mission. The month starts with the feast of **St Thérèse of Lisieux** and draws to a close with **World Mission Sunday** – a special day of prayer and global solidarity celebrated in all Catholic parishes around the world.

"You shall be my witnesses" (Acts 1:8) These words were spoken by the Risen Jesus to his disciples just before his Ascension into heaven, as we learn from the Acts of the Apostles. *The call of every Christian is to bear witness to Christ*

This is the central point, the heart of Jesus' teaching to the disciples, in view of their being sent forth into the world. The disciples are to be witnesses of Jesus, thanks to the grace of the Holy Spirit that they will receive. Wherever they go and in whatever place they find themselves. In a similar way, every Christian is called to be a missionary and witness to Christ. And the Church, the community of Christ's disciples, has no other mission than that of bringing the Gospel to the entire world by bearing witness to Christ. To evangelize is the very identity of the Church.

Each baptised person is called to mission. Missionaries of Christ are not sent to communicate themselves, to exhibit their persuasive qualities and abilities or their managerial skills. Instead, theirs is the supreme honour of presenting Christ in words and deeds, proclaiming to everyone the Good News of his salvation, as the first apostles did, with joy and boldness.

Prayer - We pray that every member of the Church may be witnesses of Christ by word and deed, wherever they find themselves. May the Spirit inspire each of us to offer the right word, at the right time and in the right way. Amen
