Sunday, 13th October 2024 Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

'Treasures ín Heaven'

The encounter between Jesus and the rich man takes place within the broader theme of discipleship in Mark's Gospel. In Jewish tradition, wealth was often seen as a sign of God's blessing and favour. However, Jesus reinterprets wealth as something that can hinder inner personal/spiritual growth if it is not used generously or if it becomes a source of attachment.

The rich man's attachment to his possessions prevents him from responding to Jesus' call to discipleship. Jesus emphasises the difficulty for the wealthy to enter God's Kingdom, not because wealth itself is evil, but because it can become a barrier to entering wholehearted into living life as God asks. We never fully enter life if we are focused on money or possessions.

The rich young man is sincere in his desire for eternal life, but he is unwilling to part with his possessions to follow Jesus fully. While wealth and possessions are not inherently wrong, the Gospel reminds us that attachment to them can hinder our relationship with God

In a world that often promotes the accumulation of wealth, success, and comfort, Jesus' words challenge us to live counter-culturally. True discipleship means trusting God above all else and being willing to let go of anything that competes for our loyalty and devotion to Him. The Gospel calls us to invest in "treasures in heaven" through acts of generosity and compassion.

The man's sorrow when he hears Jesus' challenge reflects the struggle of letting go. It is hard to let go of attachments and the superficial material things that act as our crutches for the way we like to present ourselves to others. Our insecurities tempt us to trust or indulge in things, rather than trusting that God has made us to be enough in ourselves without the addition of more property or possessions.

Prayer - We pray that every member of the Church may be witnesses of Christ by word and deed, wherever they find themselves.
