The call to greatness

Jesus accepted his disciples as he found them and set about forming them for a life of service and self- giving. His own example is a model for them to imitate. This weekend we hear him insist that in a life of service of God vying for the limelight and status has no place.

Not yet blessed with that wisdom as they travel towards Jerusalem, the sons of Zebedee express their ambition for pride of place with him in glory. While they completely miss the point of what he has been saying, Jesus allows them to be themselves. Jesus takes the request of James and John seriously, explains how it is out of place in his vision of things and then seeks to direct their energy towards a life of service.

Where there is a competition for prominence and status, the energy left over for a generous life of service is greatly diminished. The first disciples gradually came to the insight that the core call in every life is the call to service. As apostles they needed to discover for themselves that unless they listened to God, they would have nothing worthwhile to say to the world.

In Jesus' scheme of things, the call to greatness is a call to serve God and to serve his people by helping them to reach the destiny God has in store for them.
