In the modern world which we in these parts find ourselves living, Christmas is for many people a winter festival with a nod to a *past event*. It gets people shopping and indulging.

In the Christian culture, Christmas celebrates what God is *still doing*, how God is still present with us now and into the future So, while we still get ready for Christmas, we put up our Christmas tree, we exchange cards and presents, we too shop and modestly indulge: nonetheless the spirit in which we do these things is one of confidence, enjoying the life God has given us so far as we can, and trusting in God and valuing what we have even when it falls short and troubles abound.
