#### Christmas 2024

Each year at this time we hear the ancient story of Christmas. We retell and reflect on the astonishing entry of God into our broken world. The invisible, unseen God became like one of us, though without sin.

It is difficult to reflect on the Christmas celebrations without reflecting on St Luke's gospel. Luke, like an artist, paints a beautiful picture of a virgin with child, Joseph her husband, shepherds in their fields surprised by jubilant angels, not to mention people coming with gifts to visit a child wrapped in swaddling clothes lying in a manger.

As a story and a picture painted on a Christmas card it is beautiful, yet the reality of the first Christmas must have been a lot different. It's the story of a young couple who have a child without a roof over their heads. They find themselves in a stable with this special child whom angels sing about, and shepherds come to see.

Despite the fragility of the situation Luke invites us to enter a joyful and happy occasion. Just as people mentioned in the gospel were invited, likewise the invitation has been extended to all people. The Christmas story is an invitation to see God in the fragility of human nature.

Central to the Bethlehem story was that each of the people involved had a selfless concern for the other. There was no selfishness, or looking after oneself only, on that first Christmas day. Not only Jesus, but Mary and Joseph, too, accepted personal vulnerability and disadvantage for themselves so that others might be blessed.

This love of God when replicated in human beings is a source of hope and a real reason to be happy, upbeat and joyful even in a year that has seen much doom, gloom and bad news. During much economic negativity Christmas is the reminder of all that is good in our world - a source of inspiration and encouragement for all at this time.

In the secular world Christmas ends late on the evening of Christmas Eve but for the believing follower of Christ the Christmas story lives on into the New Year and presents all of us with an opportunity to profoundly change our lives.
