Word of God Sunday

Word of God Sunday is a celebration that invites Catholics to renew their relationship with the Bible and to listen attentively to the living Word of God that speaks to the Church and the world. It serves as a reminder of the foundational role of Scripture in Christian life and the ongoing relevance of God's message.

Although primarily a Catholic observance, its focus on the Bible resonates across the many Christian traditions. Pope Francis' intention (in introducing this new observance in 2020) was also to foster unity among Christians by promoting a sharing in the respect for the Scriptures and in encouraging participation in a deeper dialogue and reflection on God's Word across denominations.

"My lífe ís my Message"

The Word of God serves many functions — it can be an invitation and at times a challenge to grow, a call to march on where there is the temptation to regress and take comfort in the past. Many times the Word of God calls for a change of heart. It is always a call to face reality and to take the courage to take responsibility for what is given to us. To those who accept God's Word it can be experienced as a gift, as a challenge, but also as power because God is present in His Word.

At Nazareth Jesus set out a programme for his ministry. The Word that had promised a radical renewal of hearts and minds was spoken with new power by Jesus. The saving presence of God is a presence about to set free at a new level. His compassion sees great potential for growth.

That mercy is powerfully effective in bringing about transformation. His Word is good news for the poor, for those who know their need of him. It is effective in liberating those who are captives to fear or crippled by guilt and shame. The year of God's favour does not end because the sun never sets on the days of God's mercy.
