# Only the love of God

In today's Gospel we hear the Lord give Peter his mission as a fisher of men. Peter is told to launch out into the deep. Experience has taught him that for fishermen every day is different. Where a shoal of fish can be found today might or might not be the place where it will be found tomorrow.

Peter has the privilege of experiencing the Lord's touch before setting out. That healing touch which has renewed him several times already would renew him again and again on his mission. Peter is sent out, aware that it is the Lord who is the fisher of men, that it is the Lord who makes every mission fruitful.

All followers of Christ are, like Peter, called to be missionaries. Like Peter we must be aware that we are instruments in the hand of God who does great things through those who generously put themselves at his service. Like fishermen a range of strategies is required, and we need to be able to adapt to new situations. There will be days, maybe weeks and months, when no one takes the bait, and no one is brought to know Jesus. There will be many times during life when weariness will set in, and enthusiasm will falter.

When fatigue and weariness set in it is only the love of God that can renew us. Peter is a reminder that the presence of the Lord is the one that continues to renew.

At the sight of the great catch Peter was overwhelmed. Gratitude brought him closer to the Lord and that same gratitude inspired him to put himself at the service of the Lord.

Today we look at the vocations of Isaiah, St Paul and St Peter. They are called in strange circumstances. They each recognise their unworthiness but have the assurance that God will be with them. Through our Baptism we also are called to build God's kingdom.
