Jesus's call to love our enemies is one of the greatest challenges he puts to those who seek to serve him. The 'enemy' is someone who poses a threat to us. That can be a threat to our safety, our good name, our peace, to our freedom, to life itself. The danger may be very real or felt as real. The hurt already caused and the threat, real or imagined, can cause tension, stress, anger, a desire to seek justice done, even a desire for revenge. One or all of these things can make forgiveness very difficult.

The inability to forgive gives the 'enemy' power over us, power they have no right to have. To forgive is to claim our freedom. Forgiving of past hurts is a letting go of any desire for revenge. It often means letting go of and hope that we will see justice done or revenge. Forgiveness is often the price we must pay in order to reclaim our freedom.

This weekend Jesus is saying to his followers that down the centuries you have heard it said 'But I say this to you who are listening: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who treat you badly" and "Be compassionate as your Father is compassionate".

The message of Jesus goes against everything we hear in our individualistic, material culture. Yet it is the message of Jesus as he calls us to be merciful just as our heavenly father is merciful.

He is inviting us to a new way – the way of God our Father
