"Do Not put off until tomorrow"

The call to repentance in the gospel this weekend is a call to turn one's face towards Jesus and allow the warmth of his gentleness and mercy to touch our lives. There is a pressing urgency about his invitation because opportunities are lost in delay.

Jesus is in a hurry to let his gift of salvation take effect. His story of the fig tree is a reminder of the areas of life where there is zero growth. Stagnation could be because God is being kept at a safe distance. Lent, springtime is intended to be a time of new life, a time to prepare by removing roadblocks that might prevent Easter Joy.

It is a very popular thing for many of us to put off until tomorrow. Adopting a care free attitude, delaying the response, putting on the long finger is the easy thing to do. Yet lent calls for action now, not let opportunities slip. It is important that we grasp the opportunity of a lifetime in the lifetime of the opportunity.

"Preach the Gospel everywhere"

Francis of Assisi once invited a young friar to go with him into the town to preach. They spent all day walking through the streets and then came home. When the day's journey was done, the young friar was disappointed and asked "Weren't we supposed to preach today?" Francis replied, "We have preached. We were preaching while we were walking. We were seen by many and our behaviour was noted. It is of no use walking anywhere to preach unless we preach wherever as we walk!"

Francis said: "Preach the Gospel everywhere, and if necessary, use words." Witnessing to Jesus is more than quoting the bible – it is living the word of God each day. The fig tree that bore no fruit is like a Christian who attempts no good works and lives a purely selfish life.
