'Why go to Mass'

Most of us have a favourite place, or more than one, where we feel at peace with ourselves and with the world. It might be on the side of a mountain, or on a

particular stretch of river. It might just be your own back garden. Quite often, amid the beauty of creation, our hearts are lifted to God our Creator.

In every religious tradition, there are Sacred Spaces where people gather. For the Hebrew people down through the ages, it was the Temple in Jerusalem. The Temple was the visible sign of God's presence among his they came to offer Sacrifice.

People often comment these days that we do not gather as much as we used to. We send texts and emails; we chat on WhatsApp and other platforms; we shop online, and we live-stream our sports. It is all very convenient, but it doesn't build relationships. We are created for relationship, and gathering is an essential part of that.

Last weekend, the Irish Bishops published a pastoral message in which they renewed the invitation of Jesus for all Catholics to come regularly to the Sunday Eucharist. When we gather for the Eucharist we bring to God the gift of our worship, acknowledging Him as our Creator; the source of all our Hope and of everything in us that is good and wise and true.

There may be a variety of reasons why people don't come for the Eucharist, or at least why they think they don't come. Life is busy. People are time-poor and have many responsibilities. There are also many other ways to pass the time. When we come to Mass we come as we are, with our anxieties, our vulnerabilities and our sinfulness, but then we are healed and renewed as we listen together to God's Word, as we pray and sing together and as we come, together, to the table of the Eucharist to receive the Body and Blood of Jesus.

Canonisation of Blessed Carlo Acutis

On *Sunday 7th September*, the Holy Father Pope Leo XVI will formally canonise Carlo Acutis in a ceremony deferred from 27th April following the death of Pope Francis. Carlo was born in England in 1991 and died of leukaemia in 2006. According to his mother, Carlo lived a very ordinary life like other young teenagers, but the extraordinary aspect of his life is how he opened his heart to Jesus, putting Jesus first in his life and subsequently to impart love with those whose lives he touched. It is fitting that on a Sunday where the Gospel urges a reflection on our own priorities, we may ask to what degree we impart love on the lives that we touch in our own family, school, workplace and community. A relic of Carlo was gifted to the Cathedral and will be venerated in a time of prayer on Sunday 7th from 3.00pm-6.30pm, followed by a Mass of thanksgiving of the canonisation by Bishop Donal McKeown at 7.00pm.
