'Buying up the poor for money'



Money features strongly among the most prominent of human concerns. Money — its uses and abuses — is the main theme of our readings today.

'Money makes the world go round'. So sang Liza Minnelli in the popular 1972 musical, Cabaret. According to Daniel Kahneman, 'Money may not buy you happiness, but the lack of it will certainly buy you misery'.

Our first reading from the prophet Amos, underlines the abuses to which greed for money gives rise. Amos lived in the eighth century BC, one of those rare periods when Israel was relatively peaceful and prosperous.

Ideal opportunities for trading had triggered 'an economic miracle', leading to undreamed of riches for some people. Behind this success story, Amos sees a world of injustice. What they are doing is 'buying up the poor for money' (Amos 8:6).

Fearlessly, Amos castigates those who engage in such practices, 'who trample on the needy and try to suppress the poor'. He tells them that God 'will not forget a single thing you have done' (cf. Amos 8:7).

Today's gospel speaks about stewardship. A steward is a person who is given responsibility to handle the goods and property of his/her employer. In the words of Joyce Meyer, 'We must remember that we are stewards of what God has provided for us, not owners. We have no absolute right to anything we have.

So the question today's gospel puts to us is: 'How well am I using the resources the Lord has provided me with for his service and the service of others?' Am I using them to make the kind of friends Jesus refers to in the Gospel – friends who will welcome me 'into the tents of eternity' (Lk 16:9)?
