The size of a mustard seed



The image of the mustard seed is used several times throughout the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and as we hear this week, the Gospel according to St Luke. There is some dispute about what the 'mustard plant might have looked like. Some say it was a shrub that got its name as it grew mustard-coloured flowers, others

saying it was just a weed that served no great purpose for providing food but did provide shelter, the birds nested in it. What is agreed on though, is that the size of the mustard seed as it was known, was insignificant and no bigger than a small grain of dust. The mulberry tree on the other hand was the opposite – it was strong and had deep roots and difficult to move.

Once again, the Gospel according to St Luke makes the insignificant, significant. The weak become strong and the poor become rich. It is easy to compare ourselves to others in faith matters just as it is to compare with those with the new car or the nice house. Would I be like the apostles asking Jesus to increase my faith? Do I look at someone else and be envious of their devotion, their frequent attendance at Mass or their time spent in prayer?

We need to be careful; faith is such a difficult thing to measure using human standards large or small. Yet by our senses, faith can be seen in our actions, heard in our words and often can be touched by our presence.

Let us not be concerned whether our faith is the size of a mustard seed or a mulberry tree. What is more important is firstly we have faith — and then watch it grow in our life-long witness to Christ. Whatever way we witness to Christ through these gifts, we are doing no more than what the Gospel asks of us, that we have done the duty that is required of us as servants.
