KING TO ALL WHO ACCEPT HIM

St Luke in the gospel this weekend relates the events on Calvery with great skill and gives an insight into how the mercy of Jesus transforms lives. He begins with those furthest out and gradually moves closer to the Cross, describing five attitudes to Jesus.

Furthest from the Cross are the people who stood by, watching. They are uninvolved, not drawn into the drama of what was taking place, yet he remarks that some went home beating their breasts.

Next are the leaders of the time who jeer at Jesus, seeing him as a rival. Nailed to the Cross and powerless, they taunt him, calling on him to prove he is the Christ by saving himself. Likewise for the soldiers who understand him in political terms and who were used to being treated badly it was a chance to vent their anger. Jesus responds with silence

Luke then brings us to the criminals one tries to exploit the power that Jesus has with his self-serving plea: "Save yourself and us as well." Jesus does not allow himself to be used for selfish purposes. Luke then takes us to the second criminal. He does not lapse into self-pity but turns to Jesus in trust. He takes responsibility for his past and puts his confidence in Jesus welcoming Jesus into his life as king and saviour in a personal way.

On Calvery his wounds and pain are transformed into wisdom a wisdom that can inspire all of us to make space for Jesus to heal our wounds.

Central to the account of the events on Calvery is the inscription that states Jesus is King. He is King to all those who are open to accept his gift of salvation.
