A Prophet of Hope

All four Gospels agree to an important truth: that John the Baptist is the one who marks the end of the time of waiting and the beginning of the new age in Jesus. John the Baptist has an unusual address; c/o the wilderness. It was in the desert that the people of God first met God. In the desert the people were tested. So, it is appropriate that again the word of God should come to the people in the wilderness.

John appears as a somewhat eccentric figure when we look at his wardrobe and diet. In an extraordinary tribute to the power of John St Matthew tells us that people from Judea and Jerusalem make their way to him. The people come to listen to him because they believe he speaks the authentic word of God. Those who are moved by him confess their sins and are baptised. In being baptised the people make a public profession to begin to change their lives.

The tone of John the Baptist's preaching is strong because of his desire to move his hearers from complacency to action. Pride and self-satisfaction in the practice of their faith resulted in stiff resistance to change.

Conversion is a process. The first step is to identify accurately what is needed. Every generation needs conversion to God's way because complacency is a permanent temptation and comfort zones are always attractive.

John the Baptist urges his hearers to return to their roots, to a fresh look at their relationship with God. Let God be God he urges. In letting God be God we can put new energy into our commitment and renew our enthusiasm for service. Hope begins with facing reality, John is a prophet of hope.
