The Baptism of the Lord

At our Baptism the Holy Spirit is given to us to help us to be a follower of Christ.

The word '**baptism**' comes from the Greek word **bapto**, meaning "**I dip**". When they wanted to change the colour of a garment the Greeks dipped it in a dye. The dipping was repeated until the garment had taken on the new colour fully. For us baptism is the beginning of a life-long process. We will be dipped repeatedly in the experience of Christ until we fully learn his values and attitudes.

As we move through the Church year, we are reminded of what this dipping involves. At Christmas we celebrate the birthday of Jesus and dip into the joy of the event. On the first Sunday of Lent, we recall the testing of Jesus in the wilderness and reflect on our own temptations and struggles. On Good Friday we ponder the mystery of his death. At Easter we rejoice over Jesus' rising from the dead and reflect on our own death and the promise of new life. Pentecost is a time to welcome the Holy Spirit and reflect on the gifts that the Spirit bring.

Baptism is a decisive moment because through it we participate in the baptism of Jesus. The waters of baptism wash away our sins and brings us new life. At his baptism Jesus was marked out and gave a clear direction to his life. A life at the service of the Father and revealing God's love for us.

Likewise, for us baptism consecrates us for the living of our vocation. It is the first step pointing us in the direction of following Christ. Many more steps are required for us to grow into the likeness of Jesus Christ.

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity – The week of Prayer for Christian Unity is traditionally observed from **18th – 25th January** the octave of St Peter and St Paul.

For 2026 the theme is "There is one body and one spirit" (Eph 4:4) and the suggested prayer and texts were provided by the Armenian Apostolic Church along with the Armenian Catholic Church. In the Waterside area our Unity service will take place on **Wednesday, 21st January** beginning at Ebrington Presbyterian Church at 7.00pm and finishing at St Columb's church for prayer and cup of tea/coffee.
