Admiration or Imitation?

If you were employing twelve people to mind your business for you after you had gone, knowing what you know after hearing the full story would you have picked the twelve you got? Thomas doubted him, Peter denied him and Judas betrayed him, in fact one of the few things the followers all did in unison was desert Jesus when he was facing arrest by the authorities!

But God's ways are not our ways the scriptures often tell us. We mark the feast days of the apostles and many other worthy men and women throughout the church's year. These days during the year we remember the saints, not because they lived lives without fault and fully dedicated to God. When it comes to a life dedicated to God, they got it wrong - and often spectacularly wrong. What we remember is the way that they acknowledged their difficulties in relationship with God and turned their complicated lives around.

God understands that we won't always get it right. Even if we don't always get things right, we always can put things right. We can forgive. We can ask for forgiveness. We can attend Mass, bringing our worries, prayers and thanksgiving before the altar. We can come with contrition to the Sacrament of Confession and receive the grace of the Holy Spirit.

We reflect at the apostles or the saints now and admire their contribution to the Church we are part of today. While it is important we do admire, it is also an opportunity to imitate their daily acts of conversion of our own hearts, which is a life-long journey no matter how far we think we have turned away from God.
